Five components of the Vertebral Subluxation Complex

How to assess:

1. Kinesiopathology —

- abnormal motion or alignment
 - a. motion palpation
 - b. range of motion
 - c. videofluoroscopy

2. Neuropathophysiology —

- abnormal nervous system function
 - a. various types of skin and infrared temperature devices
 - b. thermography
 - c. nerve conduction studies

3. Myopathology —

- abnormal muscle function
 - a. static palpation
 - b. surface EMG
 - c. electric muscle testing

4. Histopathology —

- abnormal soft tissue function
 - a. static palpation
 - b. MRI

5. Arthropathophysiology —

- (previously just called pathophysiology or biochemical changes) abnormal bony changes
 - a. spinography (chiropractic x-ray findings)
 - b. MRI
 - c. CT scan


