would miss something important. Many of them started off by attending a pediatrics seminar or conference given by ICA. Next we found them in our 3-year post-graduate diplomate program. During the first year they started to see children with confidence. By the end of the third year they not only had tremendous confidence they were already attracting children to their practices. They learned the language and were able to communicate effectively with parents, pediatricians and other practitioners about chiropractic. This has happened time and again over the years. The word spread quickly in their communities and not only have their practices grown but as a result more children are now receiving chiropractic care.

This scenario is quite common, and having graduated some of the finest pediatric practitioners from our diplomate program, we understand the im-

portance of education in the process of establishing a successful pediatric practice.

**Conclusion**

If you want to start caring for children in your practice but are still hesitant I would suggest you start with Step #1. Attend a pediatrics seminar or go listen to someone who is giving a lecture on pediatrics and see how it affects you. You can also attend the ICA Pediatric Council's Annual Conference this November in Nashville, Tenn., where you will meet hundreds of practitioners, some who may be just "thinking" of caring for children, others who care for some children in their practices, and many who are passionate about caring for kids and are "pediatric" practitioners.
