

Diplomate in Philosophical Chiropractic Standards

The Council has also developed a 320-hour Diplomate in Philosophical Chiropractic Standards in cooperation with the Palmer Institute for Professional Advancement. This postgraduate program may be taken over a period of 3-5 years. Doctors who have completed Palmer College's one year postgraduate Philosophy Colloquium can enroll in the second year of the diplomate program. Most of the sessions will be offered online with 18-hour weekend programs on-site at Davenport, as well as a few self-study hours. Doctors who complete the required hours may then sit for the DPhCS exam of the ICA Council on Chiropractic Philosophy.
