Dr. Cheryl Hawk Appointed New CCGPP Research Commission Chair

The Council on Chiropractic Guidelines and Practice Parameters (CCGPP) recently named Cheryl Hawk, D.C., Ph.D. the new chair of the CCGPP Research Commission. Dr. Hawk replaces outgoing chair Jay Triano, D.C., Ph.D. who has accepted a position with the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College. The announcement was made in Pittsburgh during a meeting of the CCGPP Council and the CCGPP Research Commission captians, June 22 and 23.

Dr. Hawk is vice president of research and scholarship at Cleveland Chiropractic College. A 1976 graduate of National College of Chiropractic and a full-time practitioner for 12 years, she earned her PhD in Preventive Medicine from the University of Iowa in 1991. She has been the primary writer of successful grant and contract proposal totaling more than \$5 million and has authored more than 60 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters.

Academic Dean to Serve on Workers' Comp Medical Evidence Advisory Committee

Gary Globe, D.C., Ph.D., provost and academic dean at Cleveland-Los Angeles has been named to serve on the Medical Advisory Committee for the California Division of Workers' Compensation. Globe was asked to accept the appointment by Anne Searcy, M.D., medical director for the Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) and an appointee of Governor Schwarzenegger.

"Given Dr. Globe's background in research and education, coupled with his many years of real work practice experience, he will become a valuable member of the advisory committee," said Cleveland President Dr. Carl S. Cleveland, III. "He is well-positioned to translate the relevant research information in context of the field practitioner perspective and the chiropractic profession's role in managing the various injuries sustained within the California's Workers' Compensation system."

The purpose of the DCW is to provide administrative and judicial services in dispute resolutions involving claims for workers' compensation benefits in the state of California. The 17-member committee is comprised of a broad range of medical professionals, from chiropractic to neurosurgery and internal medicine. The committee reviews cases as needed and makes advisory recommendations to the director regarding a schedule for medical treatment.

Globe, who is also vice president of planning and assessment for Cleveland college's multi-campus system will serve one two-year term on the committee.

complaints are received most frequently and the types of entities most often required to take corrective action as a result of consumer complaints. The other information on the Web site covers consumers' rights to access their health information and significantly control how their personal health information is used and disclosed, as well as guidance about how to submit complaints about possible violations of the law and extensive guidance for entities who must comply with the rule.
